There is advanced software system in the college through which the management seeks various types of information.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The Curriculum is designed by the University through BOS.
- Dr.A.D.Joshi has worked as a member of Syllabus Committee of B.Com –I (English) appointed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur
- Many faculty members participated in the workshops organized for the syllabus by the other colleges and University.
- The college has designed the Syllabus for Career Oriented Course of Tourism.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college encourages teacher for the use of technology in the teaching. Most of the faculty members follow innovative teaching methods. Use of multimedia theatre and language lab in teaching and learning is a routine practice of the college. Most of the faculties uses ppt , internet while teaching. Group discussion, Seminars and paper presentations are organised to encourage participatory learning.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The examination procedure is implemented in the college as per the norms of the University. There is Central Assessment of Papers done by the University. However, there is an in house examination committee which undertakes the internal examination and follows evaluation system which is conveyed to the students and the improvement is made by faculty based on the performance of the students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- In house research committee is in place.
- It promotes all the teachers to go for minor and major research.
- It organises various activities like guest lectures, workshops and seminars for faculties.
- Three proposals of Faculty Development Programmes are awaiting sanction from UGC.
- Moreover last year's students are given project work every year. They are also motivated to undertake project work.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The college library purchases 2159 text books of Rs.77193/-, 76 reference books of Rs.51062/- and 3 Journals of Rs.900/-,
- 4 Stacks are added in Library infrastructure.
- Laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Microbiology are established.
- Two computers are added in administrative office.

- The college has formed College Ladder which includes the principal, vice-principal, Faculty Heads of all the faculties and Heads of the entire department.

- The college provides academic expertise to the neighbouring schools, colleges and social organizations.

- Various activities under Socrates club, Research Committees are organised to enrich human resource.

**Best Practice-II
Scholarship Cell**

Goals:

- i. To create awareness among the students about various scholarships and financial assistance offered by state, central and various social organisations.
- ii. To empower rural and needy students through various scholarships.
- iii. To motivate students to achieve higher performance to obtain scholarship throughout the course.
- iv. To inspire students to pursue higher education with the help of scholarship.

The Context:

Nowadays the cost of higher education is increasing day by day. Most of the rural students remain out of the periphery of higher education due to financial strains as well as they do not know the various scholarships and financial assistance available for them apart from the routine scholarships. Keeping this in view, the college has established a Separate Scholarship Cell. Prof.S.A.Diwan is wilfully working as the coordinator of this cell. He, apart from regular scholarship schemes, provides counselling and helpdesk for obtaining various 18 state, national level scholarships and financial assistance for the eligible students.

The Practice:

Separate and dedicated cell is established to make the students aware of various scholarships available for them. Prof. S.A.Diwan works as a coordinator of the same. The students are conveyed through notices and classroom instructions. The cell collects all related and necessary documents from students concerned and guides them about various scholarships and financial assistance for which they are eligible. Necessary help and guidance is provided to the students for document verification, opening of bank account and linking Adhar card with it. Proper follow up is taken by the cell to avail as much as scholarships to the students.

Evidence of Success:

It has proved as one of the best and beneficial practice of the college as 495 students of the college have availed various scholarships. Normally the students used to get the regular and routine scholarship. They were not aware of various other 18 scholarships available for them at state and national level. However the cell took initiative and availed the students various state and National level scholarship worth Rs. 30,00,000/-. This contribution of the cell encourages and empowers the rural students at large to pursue their higher education and prevents probable dropout of the students.

Problem Encountered and Resources Required:

Most of the students of the college do not know about these special scholarships, therefore, the cell has to take lot of efforts to communicate the students concerned. The poor connectivity of internet in the rural area is one of major problem occurred while managing online procedure. Separate fund has to be earmarked to strengthen the cell including infrastructure and equipments.
