6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college always tries to follow new methods of teaching and learning.

1. For effective teaching the faculty members use Class rooms speakers, Smart boards, LCD Projector, visualizer, Slide Projector etc.
2. The college has separate multi media room, which used for effective teaching.
3. The teaching methods like Participatory learning and experimental learning are followed by the faculty members. They are stated below

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The examination procedure is implemented in the college as per the norms of the University. There is Central Assessment of Papers done by the University. However, there is an in house examination committee i.e. Internal evaluation committee which undertakes the internal examination and follows evaluation system which is conveyed to the students and the improvement is made by faculty based on the performance of the students. Besides the Internal examination, Home Assignments, Unit tests, Open book exam and surprise tests are organised by the faculty members.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- In house research committee is in place.
- It promotes all the teachers to go for minor and major research.
- It organises various activities like guest lectures, workshops and seminars for faculties.
- The college has adopted the research encouraging scheme which provide Rs.1000/- for the faculty who publishes his or her research article in peer reviewed journals.
- Moreover last year's students are given project work every year. They are also motivated to undertake project work.

- There is separate library building, which covers reading hall, stacks for magazines, reference books section and separate study section for faculty.

- The college has two storey building with 29 classrooms, One multimedia hall, one seminar hall, computer and language lab, gym station, Administrative wing, IQAC office, Exam section, faculty and committee head chambers, Office of Secretary of the Institution.
- The has various teaching equipments like Lcd projector, Visualiser, smart board, slide projector, audio video system, megaphones, video and still camera, Computers etc. Besides the colleges has power backup system, printers, reprographic machines, scanner etc.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The college has formed College Ladder which includes the principal, vice-principal, Faculty Heads of all the faculties and Heads of the entire department.

1. The college organised a campus interview for ICICI bank recruitment. Seventy seven students have the interview and 33 students were selected.
2. The students of Chemistry department received a one day industrial training at Gokul Milk Processing Unit, Kolhapur.
3. The students of Chemistry department visited National Institute of Oceanography and Goa National Centre Panjim (Goa).
4. The students of Microbiology department actively participated in the Soil Testing training organised by Sadashivrao Mandlik Irrigation, Agricultural, Educational and Cultural Development Research Foundation, Kolhapur.
5. The students of Microbiology department SG Farma, Shirwal and Mapro Food Industry Wai as a part of study tour.

Though the college does not have any formal collaboration with industries, however the college always tries for occasional collaboration with industries around. For instance the Department of Commerce organised 'Commerce Week' in collaboration with Bank of India, Branch- Murgud. The bank gave financial sponsorship of Rs.10000/- for the same.

Best Practice-II

THE EXHIBITION OF POSTERS OF MIGRATED AND RESIDENT BIRDS

Goals:

- i. To introduce students to the birds' species those migrate to Murgud Water Reservoir along with resident birds.
- ii. To motivate students to take part in research activity to develop Research Culture.
- iii. To make aware people and students about the flora and fauna of the area.
- iv. To link the society to the activity of the college making it as a social awareness activity.

The Context:

Our college is always in pursuit of undertaking innovative activities for enriching students learning experiences as well as to create social awareness among the students. As a part of it, the college undertook an exhibition of posters of migrated and resident birds in the academic year 2017-18. The main purpose behind undertaking this activity is to focus on importance of nature and natural resources and it's linking with human life. The college decided to arrange the exhibition in Murgud town to establish interlink between the college and the society around. The college, in the history of Murgud, initially unveiled the great natural heritage of Murgud to the citizens of Murgud and the surrounding villages.

The Practice:

The Environmental Resource and Conservation Centre and **The Department of Zoology** jointly organized the activity. The faculty members with select students snapped the migrated birds arrive in Murgud Water Reservoir Zone in winter. They indentified the birds and their morphological, migratory period peculiarities, nation and usefulness and explained them to the students. This research activity is undertaken by Mr.Rahul Kamble, Asst.Professor, Zoology Dept. in association with ERCC of the college. 58 students were participated in the activity. Furthermore the Centre and Department decided to arrange the exhibition of the same in Murgud Town for the citizens of and around Murgud.

The exhibition displayed total 57 posters of bird species which includes 20 posters of migrated birds and 37 of resident birds. The poster covers Scientific and local name of the bird, its image, food habit, migratory period. Following the inauguration of the exhibition at the auspicious hands of eminent environment activist Dr. Bachulkar, the lecture of Dr. Bachurkar on '**Bio diversity its Conservation and Global Warming**' was arranged in the hall of Murgud Municipal town. 250 Citizens and students were presented for the same.

Evidence of Success:

The activity proved to be a successful activity as it received a tremendous response from the people (including primary, higher secondary students in surrounding area) as 950 People visited the exhibition and 81 visitors expressed their remarks in the visitor's book. It was noticed that they felt proud of the great natural heritage of Murgud and thanked the college for unveiling the same. The activity also created interest among the students thereby developing their research aptitude. The college, through this activity, established its distinguished identity among people and strengthened its deep association with society and in society building activities.

Problem Encountered and Resources Required:

No major problem occurred during the implementation of the exhibition. But there is a need to invite sponsorship to arrange this type of the programme in future.
