The early 19th Century Scandinavia Theatre

- The theatre of the Scandinavia
- Deplorable and sterile
- The dramatists followed Eugene Scribe (1791-1861)
- The plays reflected aristocratic life
- Sex, marriage and Adultery-main topics of the plays.
- Theatre as a medium of pure entertainment
- The dramas were type of melodrama or farce

Establishment of a new theatre

- A theatre was established in 1849 in Bergen (Norway)
- Theatre as an ideal means to establish new drama
- Theatre as a soap-box
- Eager to establish an independent dramatic literature and life.
- One of them is Henrik Ibsen

Henrik John Ibsen (1828-1906)

- Henrik Ibsen was born in 1828 in the small Norwegian timber port of Skien.
- Unhappy childhood days.
- His plays focused on-
- The problems of capitalist society.
- Crises of liberalism, the conflicts of bourgeois families.
- The power of economy over human relations.
- The father of realism, the pioneer of the modern drama.
- He is labelled as the realist, and the iconoclast,

Division of Ibsen's Plays

- Ibsen's work is generally worked into three phases
- The first phase- early dramas written in verse
- The second phase –the plays of protest
- The third phase- symbolic plays
- An Enemy of the People belongs to the second phase.
